

Lochmara Lodge Artist Residencies

Each season we invite applications for short term residencies at Lochmara Lodge. The residency programme allows artists to be resident at Lochmara to work on a specific project, to be inspired by Lochmara and the Marlborough Sounds, and to interact with our New Zealand and overseas guests.

The purpose of the programme is twofold:

- a) To support the development of New Zealand art by providing opportunities for artists in all stages of their career to undertake a residency, with a focus on inspiration, dedicated time, and making art accessible to new audiences.
- b) To provide an opportunity for national and international visitors to learn about New Zealand art and the creative process by talking to artists and watching them work.

Residencies in 2010/11 will:

- Be from 1 – 3 weeks long and occur between 22 September 2010 and 8 June 2011.
- Focus on a specific project or work
- Include agreed times each day where the artist must be available to the public.
- Will result in new work to be exhibited for sale at Lochmara, or credited to the Lochmara residency programme, as negotiated with Lochmara.

Residencies will include:

- Accommodation for the artist as agreed with Lochmara. This may be in a shared guide room, in the art studio loft, or in Crumpy's Camp
- A small stipend of \$100/week towards food and other associated costs. Kitchen facilities are available and resident artists are eligible for staff discount in the cafe while in residence.
- Use of the Lochmara Art Studio and equipment if desired, although resident artists can choose to work anywhere on the 14 acre Lochmara property.
- Water transfers to/from Picton at the start and end of the residency.
- Print and online promotion of the residency, with a focus on the local market.
- Access to exhibit work in the Huia or Window Gallery for the duration of the residency.

Costs

Artists are expected to meet their own costs for travel to Picton and any costs above the \$100/week stipend. Costs of materials and any shipping of work and/or materials to/from Lochmara (as far as Picton) is also the responsibility of the resident artist.

Applications and Selection

The programme is open to serious and professional artists at all stages of their artistic career. Applications are welcomed from artists working across the arts, including but not limited to: sculpture, photography, carving, writing, performance music, dance, weaving, fashion, painting, film making, and jewellery.

Applications must include a current CV and a completed Residency Application. Full terms and conditions of the residency will be negotiated with successful applicants.
